
Little Red Wagon

Nyaka Chief Operating Officer to address Kiwanis luncheon.

In 2001, Twesigye Jackson Kaguri founded Nyaka in response to the devastating impact of HIV/AIDS in his home village and surrounding districts. From the beginning, Nyaka's mission has been to provide free education to children who have lost one or both parents to HIV/AIDS. Jackson mailed a plea for help to congregations and civic groups thoughout Monroe County for assistance. Kiwanis Club of Bloomington and Rotary Club were the only civic groups to respond and Rev. David Bremer and UPC was the only congregation to respond.

In 2001 Jackson used \$5,000 meant for buying a house in the US to build a two-room school for the Nyaka community. The 24 inaugural children got uniforms, pencils, and pens. With the hard work of Jackson, Ugandans, Americans, Brits, Scandinavians, Kiwanis, Rotary and thousands of volunteers, Nyaka has expanded to three education campuses, a farm, library and

medical clinics serving over 900 children.

Reverend Montgomery Visits Kiwanis and Aktion Club of Bloomington. Aktion Club: where development has no disability

Aktion Club is the only service club for adults with disabilities, with more than 10,000 members worldwide. Club members become competent, capable, caring leaders through the vehicle of service. Kiwa-

> nis Club of Bloomington amd Kiwanis Club of South Central Indiana are co-sponsors of Aktion Club of Bloomington.

> One of the service projects Aktion Club has launched for 2023-2024 is the Bottle Caps to Benches Campaign. Plastic bottle caps are collected and recycled into benches for public places (details may be found on a following page).

> Kiwanis Club of Bloomington pledged to help Aktion Clubers collect bottle caps. When Rev. Montgomery heard of this service project, with Session's approval, she let Kiwanis Club and Aktion Club know that the people of UPC have pledged to assist with the collation of plastic caps. UPC has done an excellent job!

On Thursday, February 15, Kiwanis Club of Bloomington invited the officers of Aktion Club to give a talk on the status of their activities and projects as well as to present the Kiwanis col-

lection of caps. UPC was also invited to present their plastic cap collection.

President Jake and Vice President Aaron were introduced. Aaron is Charter President of Aktion Club, formed 16 years ago. Their activities include an annual talent show with the upcoming 2024 show celebrating the events 10th anniversary. The Bloomington All-Abilities Choir was founded five years ago and 20 Aktion members are active in the choir.

Kiwanis Hoosier Division Lt. Governor Vanessa McClary (member of both Kiwanis Club of Bloomington and Kiwanis Club of South Central Indiana) serves as Kiwanis advisor to Aktion Club.

A huge garbage bag of caps was presented to Aktion Club by Rev. Montgomery. In the photo above, from 1 to r, are Aaron, Lt. Governor Vanessa, Jake, Pastor Cheryl and Kiwanis President Phillip. The Aktion Club officers were very grateful.

Green Tree Plastics Information

These items are NOT ACCEPTABLE:

Medicine "BOTTLES" (prescription or OTC bottles are not acceptable)

the actual drink "BOTTLES" (bottles are a different kind of plastic than the caps)

any Cap with a Silicon Lining (from chemicals/cleaners, this would include some bleach and motor oil caps)

"Pumps & Trigger Sprayers" (soap/lotion pumps, they may be plastic, but they have pieces inside them that are not acceptable)

"Fast-Food Drink Lids" (these are the wrong type of plastic. This includes fast-food cup lids & coffee drink lids, as well as the lids from deli items at Wal-Mart)

> "Bags" (Plastic Ziplock bags or Grocery Bags)

Any "Food" Container (even if the plastic recycle number is a 2, 4 or 5)

K-Cups, Straws, Medical Supplies, plastic pieces that are not a lid/cap
